

I met her when adopting my elder daughter at a state-run orphanage in Tehran. I still so vividly recall her piercing, yet despondent eyes as she looked up at me and asked with such might, "WHY NOT ME?" That sent a shudder through my body and a dagger through my heart. I could not fathom such strength coming from a girl of her age and situation. That moment was etched in my heart forever.

That brief encounter with Sepideh was the catalyst for MAP. It was then and there that I made an unspoken promise to her that while I could not adopt her, I would ensure that Sepideh and other orphaned, neglected, or abandoned children like her, so desperate for love and care would not be forgotten. I want to believe that Sepideh knows in the depth of her heart that she has not left me since the day she captivated me with her sorrow and innocence, but also her courage. And although this journey has had its share of challenges and hurdles, what we have accomplished together in the past 12 years is nothing short of a dream come true.

MAP stands today as a global network of dedicated individuals who actively work to create opportunities for children around the world. To think that MAP has impacted the lives of 800,000 children around the world takes my breath away.

We have successfully developed and implemented programs which are holistically minded and have, consequently, aided thousands of impoverished children transnationally. Between our comprehensive education, orphan care, hunger relief, and health and wellbeing programs, we have provided children with tools to help them move beyond their circumstances.

For the execution of culturally sensitive and appropriate educational/vocational training programs, we have taken great strides enlisting the guidance of local community leaders and elders. Similarly, we have effectively learned to carry out our objectives in the various countries we serve, handling roadblocks that arise through effective communication, building alliances, and the love of children as our compass to keep our mission alive.

Additionally, we have worked hard to build a community of like-minded donors and volunteers from all walks of life. Moms Against Poverty (MAP) is a global nonprofit organization with the mission to nurture and educate underprivileged children to their fullest potential, so that one day, they can contribute and lead within their own communities and break the cycle of poverty. Our work is holistically minded, advancing communities one program at a time toward well-being and self-sufficiency.

First, we address children's basic needs, such as food, shelter, and healthcare. Then, using education and vocational programs, we provide them with the tools and environment they need to thrive and become successful members of their community and the world at large.

Our programs include: Education, Hunger Relief & Basic Provisions, Health, and Orphan Care.

OUR FOUNDING STORY

In 1999, Delfarib Fanaie and her husband, Farshid Samsami, traveled to their home country of Iran, with the intent of adopting a child. Their travels took them to various orphan care centers in Tehran, where they witnessed first-hand the needs of many children.

In 2006, while adopting her oldest child, Delfarib Fanaie met a young girl by the name of Sepideh who asked her, "why can't you take me with you?" Stirred by this experience, with no way to respond to this sweet girl, Delfarib knew her life would never be the same. She became determined to inspire friends, family, and co-workers to help impoverished children.

In 2008, Delfarib's friends, touched and inspired by Sepideh's story, answered Delfarib's call to action, and together they founded a volunteer-based non-profit charitable organization. Subsequently, MAP launched its mission and programs with a holistic approach toward ending childhood poverty, guided by the principles and philosophy of Ladan Judge. Aligned with Delfarib's vision, together they breathed life into this dream.

Since then, thanks to the dedication and hard work of many individuals, MAP has become a community of like-minded individuals spanning the globe with the belief that every act of kindness, no matter how small, can radically change the life of a child and generations to come.

2006: A Seed is Planted

- While adopting her third child, a young girl by the name of Sepideh came to Delfarib Fanaie and asked her, "why can't you take me with you..." 2008: Taking a Stand to End Childhood Poverty

- In 2008, Delfarib's friends touched and inspired by Sepideh's story answered Delfarib's call to action, and together, they founded a volunteerbased non-profit charitable organization.
- MAP hosts its 1st Fundraising Gala in a donated warehouse in Burlingame, CA, raising \$61,000 to provide seed funding for the organization.
- MAP launches programs in the U.S., Cambodia and Afghanistan with a holistic approach toward ending childhood poverty.

2009: Building a Foundation for Lasting Impact

- In 2009, MAP builds a foundation for lasting impact by launching its U.S.
 Nutrition Outreach Program in Virginia, which provides nutrition assistance for children living in food insecure homes.
- In December, MAP expands its Nutrition Outreach & Basic Provisions activities, launching the Holiday Helping Hands Project in Virginia. This project helps less fortunate children in Virginia and California receive toys, gift cards, winter wear, and meals during the holiday season.
- MAP expands its reach by holding its 1st Fundraising Gala in the Washington DC Metropolitan Area.

2010: Increasing our Presence in Asia

- MAP becomes one of the first organization to receive an OFAC License to work in Iran, allowing for MAP to launch its Orphan Care Program to renovate and equip Shahid Shojaie Orphanage in Tehran.
- The MAP Board of Directors conduct their first visit to Cambodia, which leads to the opening of MAP's orphanage, HOPE Children's Home.
- MAP expands its work in Afghanistan by supporting the "Read Afghanistan" Program in 12 schools.

2011: Expanding our Global Reach into Africa

- MAP continues its program expansion into West Africa by renovating a school in Sierra Leone and sponsoring the education of 150 children.
- In March, MAP launches its first relief effort by providing basic provisions to the victims of the Tōhoku earthquake and tsunami.
- In October, MAP celebrates three years of impact by holding its 4th Annual Benefit Gala in San Francisco, hosting 1,100 guests.

2012: Building on a Strong Foundation

- MAP continues providing quality education to children in Sierra Leone, constructing two schools for children living in the villages of Svanpur and Davangar.
- MAP also continues supporting of orphans in Asia by expanding its
 Orphan Care Program to include maintaining a girls' orphanage in India.
- MAP closes 2012 by responding to two natural disasters: Hurricane Sandy in New Jersey, U.S. and an earthquake in the Azarbaijan province of Iran.

2013: Creating Lasting Impact through Education

- MAP builds its 1st school in Iran as part of the Azarbaijan Earthquake Reconstruction efforts. This state-of-the-art Girls' Highschool provides the opportunity for generations of girls to pursue higher education.
- In Iran, we establish a one of a kind Vocational Training Center for Disabled children in Kerman. This center provides vocational training for hundreds of handicapped orphans and disadvantaged children.
- MAP's Education Program launches in East Africa by constructing a school in Kenya.

2014: A Community at Work

- MAP continues its efforts to empower children living in the U.S. by expanding its Nutrition and Education programs into Hawaii.
- In India, MAP establishes a Boys Orphanage in Mukundapur and three Learning Centers, which provide free education to over 150 children living in slums.
- Thanks to the generosity and hard work of our donor community and 150 volunteers, we reach a \$500,000 revenue milestone!

2015: The Impact Flourishes

- As part of MAP's commitment to making education accessible to children from all walks of life, MAP launches its Roostamahd Project in Iran, with the goal to establish 100 daycare centers in remote villages of Iran.
- Additionally, MAP's development work in Africa continues by constructing its 1st school in Senegal.
- The hard work and commitment of everyone at MAP helps 150,000 children receive life altering support in eight countries, including the U.S., Iran, Afghanistan, Cambodia, India, Kenya, Senegal, and Sierra Leone.

2016: Expanding our Global Reach in Mexico, Nepal and Vietnam

- MAP begins work in Puerto Vallarta, Mexico by providing basic provisions and shelter for children and families living in extreme poverty in the Gardenia Projects.
- MAP's Orphan Care and Education Programs expand to Vietnam by constructing and establishing a library at Sunflower Orphanage.
- MAP builds two Learning Centers in Nepal to support the victims of a devastating earthquake.

2017: A Pivotal Year of Expansion

- MAP expands its efforts in Iran by establishing a Private Girls'
 Orphanage in Kerman and provides relief and reconstruction efforts to the victims of the devastating earthquake in Kermanshah.
- MAP's relief efforts continue by providing support to the victims of Hurricane Harvey in Texas and Hurricane Irma in Florida.
- Thanks to the immense support of our community of donors and volunteers. MAP reaches \$1M in total revenue.

2018: A Decade of Impact

- MAP celebrates ten years of operation.
- Since 2008, MAP has impacted over 200,000 children in 14 countries through its Nutrition & Basic Provisions, Education and Health Programs.
- MAP expands its work in Guatemala by providing daily meals to 400 impoverished children in San Marcos.

2019: The Foundation Grows

- MAP opens an office in San Francisco and hires three full-time employees to address growing organizational needs.
- The alumni of MAP's Music Wellness Program in Cambodia—Doch Chkae band—perform at one of at the Wacken Music Festivals in Berlin.
- MAP raises \$1.9 million to support and advance its programs in the U.S., Iran, Cambodia, India, Senegal, and Guatemala. To date, MAP has positively impacted over 800,000 impoverished children in 14 countries across the globe by providing them with food and basic provisions, healthcare and education as a pathway to break the cycle of poverty.

1 Will Definitely Become A Doctor

"The sky is blue, and the wind is blowing, as white clouds gently float above. The crunching sound of the snow beneath people's steps resembles the sound of a whimper. Everyone has gathered to learn about the new school and when it would open. I rapidly skipped my way past the crowd to reach the very front. This way, I could hear with my very own ears that the school would be built in the next year. I wanted to tell my dad the news. I wanted to tell him that I could now go to high school. I wanted to tell him that I wouldn't have to drop out of school, like my sister Giana, because there wasn't a high school nearby. Oh no, not me! I must tell my dad that the high school would be built so close and right down the street near Uncle Akbar's shop, near the bakery, near Aunt Roghieh's house.

Finally, they announced that the high school would be built by next August. They said that by next September we could begin our studies. I didn't hear the rest of the speech, as I was already running back home with my slippers in hand. I ran quickly up the hill of our village, breathless,



yet focused on arriving home amidst the bone-chilling air that kept up with me every step of the way. My feet became numb, and it became increasingly difficult to make the journey up the hill. I could no longer feel my feet as they had lost themselves in the icy burn that enveloped my every step.

As I climbed, I kept returning to thoughts of poor Giana. Oh, how bad I felt for her. She adored school just as I did, but she had to drop out of school eventually because unfortunately, the only girls high school at the time was four villages away, too far away for her to attend. If the school was only one village away, Giana would have definitely gone to school. Surely, she would have, but you see, the distance was too far away for a young girl, too unsafe! When Giana was discussing this with my Dad, I lost all hope of becoming a doctor. How could I be a doctor if I couldn't even attend high school?

Without schooling, becoming a doctor would remain a dream, only alive in the confines of my mind. I would daydream about it while milking the animals in our stable...I would escape into my thoughts and imagine a world where I could be a doctor in my humble village. No more a dream. Now, School will be close to home. As I was running up the hill, I saw our home, which was one of three clay cottages set side by side. I looked out into the distance and focused my eyes on the image in front of me: our home and those of my two uncles. With this image etched in my brain, "DAD, DAD!" I cried out. "The high school will be built by next year."

As I stood in the echo of my voice, dad was standing by the stable, unable to hear my voice. I jumped towards him, breathless yet again, uttering the news. "High School will open next year... I can go to school... I can become a doctor."

Gianna came out of the stable with a bucket of milk in hand and she passed right by me, without even the slightest glance or a word, as if I wasn't there. I felt so bad for her, my heart broke for Gianna. Dad didn't say a word, but I knew that he would allow me to attend the new school. This was more than enough for me. Drained and with frozen feet, I dragged myself inside.

My deep joy was instantly replaced by the sorrow I felt for Giana. How can I be happy and celebrate when Giana had been deprived of school? I no longer spoke a word about the news of the new high school being built in my village. Rather, I kept all of my abundant delight and happiness to myself while waiting for school to open. School would be my place to smile and be joyful.

This year, as I began my schooling in the most beautiful high school in all of Kurdistan, I smiled a growing smile. Now, I will most definitely become a doctor".....

REGIONS WE SERVE

Since 2008, Moms Against Poverty has positively impacted over 800,000 impoverished children and their families in 14 countries. MAP operates by means of its established NGOs in the U.S., Iran, Cambodia, and Senegal. Additionally, MAP works in ten other countries in collaboration with local partner NGOs.

Turkey

Turkey hosts the largest number of refugees in the world. Over 4 million children and families live in overcrowded refugee camps with lack of food, water, and sanitation. MAP has provided food and basic provisions to children living in refugee camps in Turkey.

U.S.:

MAP works with 40+ partner schools and centers in various locations across the country to provide food, hygiene, basic provisions, and education to those in need. Additionally, MAP provides humanitarian relief to the victims of natural disasters.

Mexico

MAP offers hunger relief and basic provisions support to impoverished children in various communities in Mexico. Working with our local partner, we've been creating a path to self-sufficiency for children and their families living in the poorest neighborhoods of Puerto Vallarta.

Guatemala

Combating malnutrition in Guatemala, MAP provides food to impoverished children.

Senegal:

MAP empowers children in Senegal by building schools and education programs, providing the means for children to obtain the skills they need for future employment. Additionally, MAP offers hunger relief and orphan care programs within the communities we serve in Senegal.

Sierra Leone

MAP offers basic provisions and education support to impoverished children in various communities within Sierra Leone. We empower impoverished villages by providing solar cell power and repairing wells in various villages to give them access to clean water and electricity so they can be healthy and thrive.

Iran:

MAP serves impoverished children in various provinces of Iran with the goal of providing them with a pathway out of poverty. Our programs include supporting, renovating, equipping, and building schools, orphanages, and libraries. Additionally, MAP provides orphan care, hunger relief, education, health care, and disaster humanitarian relief to children and families in need.

Afghanistan

MAP offers hunger relief and education support to impoverished children in various communities to help battle the immense poverty and food insecurity needs in the country.

Japan

MAP has provided basic provisions to the victims of disaster in Japan.

Nepal

MAP offers orphan care, hunger relief, and education support to impoverished children in various communities in one of the most impoverished countries in the world. MAP works with our local partner to provide food and basic provisions to orphaned children and impoverished families.

India

MAP offers hunger relief, education support, and orphan care to impoverished children in various communities. We have established and supported computer and education centers providing free education for children living in slums.

Vietnam

MAP has provided education resources for orphans and impoverished children in Vietnam.

Cambodia:

MAP guides disadvantaged youth of Cambodia to learn skills to break the cycle of addiction and poverty by providing free preschool and after-school classes, vocational training, foster care, and other social services to impoverished children and youth in Kandal Province.


MAP provides education and basic needs to impoverished children living in Kenya.

Education Program

MAP's education programs are designed to build a pathway out of poverty. Our programs provide children with the tools they need to improve critical thinking, problem solving skills, and foster physical and emotional well-being. We build schools, learning centers, and libraries, as well as establish and operate vocational programs that provide free classes to thousands of children globally.

Since 2008, we have accomplished the following in the regions we serve.

NORTH AMERICA (U.S.)



- Provided art and music education at four severely underserved West Oakland, California schools, in collaboration with Destiny Arts Center. This program offers much-needed mental and emotional support, provides a stable environment for the children, and helps boost self-confidence in impoverished students.
- Continually supported the STEM education program at Bryant Center in San Francisco, California. This program provides early STEM education to marginalized communities.
- Provided nutrition education for impoverished children in Northern California in partnership with Satellite Adorable Housing Associates (SAHA).
- Supported the Mentor Education Program for children at the Blind Children's Learning Center in Santa Ana, California.
- Established a library for the Guided Reading Program at Cesar Chavez & Green Oaks Academy in Palo Alto, California.
- Supported the Vocational Training Program for special needs teens at HAAS workplace readiness program in Hawaii, and renovated their classroom and purchased a farm vehicle and a 4WD truck for their program.
- Provided computers, classroom technology, and school supplies at Keonepoko Elementary School in Hawaii.
- Supported disadvantaged immigrant children (ages 4 and 5) in Pleasanton, California to attend a summer preschool program.
- Supported teen moms in California's Tri-Valley Area with educational support so that they could complete their high school education and attend college.





ASIA (Afghanistan, Cambodia, Iran, India, Nepal, Vietnam)

- Constructed, renovated, and equipped 36 schools, 32 libraries in Ardabil, Azarbaijan, Gilan, Golestan, Lorestan, Kermanshah, Khuzestan, Kurdistan, and Sistan and Baluchestan Provinces of Iran.
- Continued operating our Vocational Training Center in Kerman, Iran. This center serves disabled and disadvantaged orphans and children under the care of Social Services.
- Constructed and provided ongoing support of a Cultural & Vocational Training Center in Bushehr, Iran.
- Established a school and provided free education and vocational training at MAP's school in Cambodia. This school provides opportunities to hundreds of impoverished children living in Prek Ta Kov Commune, Kandal Province and its surrounding villages. Many of these children are at risk of being subject to forced labor, the sex trade, domestic violence, substance abuse, and exploitation.
- Funded the construction and establishment of two computer classrooms at a Mother Miracle School in India. These classrooms provide free computer education to the impoverished children within the community.
- Established and supported seven learning centers and ten computer centers in Rayagada, India. These centers provide free education and computer training for children living in slums.
- Supported the computer, literacy, and peace education programs at Surya High School and Rokhshana Girls School in Afghanistan.
- Constructed two safe learning spaces for children in two remote villages in Nepal.
- Constructed and equipped a library at an orphanage in Vietnam.



AFRICA (Kenya, Senegal, Sierra Leone)


- Constructed our fifth school in Mbour, Senegal. According to the World Food Program, nearly half of the Senegalese population - 46.7 percent - are living in poverty. MAP is committed to providing the children of Senegal a pathway towards
- Constructed two schools and a learning center, as well as the education of hundreds of children in Sierra Leone.
- Constructed an elementary school in Kenya.



Hunger Relief & Basic Program

Many impoverished children have well-intentioned families who struggle financially to provide adequate food for the family. We collaborate with schools, community centers, and shelters, both national and international, to improve the living conditions of these children and to ensure that their nutrition, personal hygiene, and basic needs are met. We work with over 30 partner schools and centers within the U.S. and international partners feeding needy children around the globe.

Since 2008, we have accomplished the following in the regions we serve.



NORTH & CENTRAL AMERICA (U.S., Guatemala, Mexico)

- Continued combating food insecurity through our Nutrition Outreach Program, providing protein and vegetables to families on a regular basis through our 30+ partner schools and centers in California, Virginia, DC, New Mexico, and Pennsylvania. In 2019 alone, we provided over 24,000 lbs of food, 3,000 personal hygiene kits, 2,500 toys, 2,000 blankets, and 660 gift cards (of \$50 value) to over 12,000 disadvantaged children and their families living in the U.S.
- Additionally, MAP has provided basic provisions to the victims of the following natural disasters in the U.S.: Hurricane Harvey in Texas, Hurricane Sandy in New Jersey, Hurricane Irma in Florida, Hurricane Mathews in North Carolina, and the Camp Fire in California.
- Combating malnutrition in Guatemala, MAP has provided daily meals to 400 impoverished children.
- Creating a path to self-sufficiency, MAP has funded the renovation of roofs and windows, provided food essentials, gas tanks, and school supplies, clothing, and school tuition fees for families living in the poorest neighborhoods of Puerto Vallarta, Mexico.

ASIA (Cambodia, Iran)

- Provided emergency flood relief (food, water, hygiene products, clothing, and other necessities) to the victims of the March 2019 floods in various provinces of Iran, including Gilan, Golestan, Lorestan, Khuzestan, and Fars.
- Provided emergency relief and basic provisions to earthquake-stricken areas of Kermanshah, East Azarbaijan and Ilam in Iran.
- Distributed food baskets to 2,030 families in Bushehr, Sistan and Baluchestan, and Khuzestan provinces in Iran during the Persian New Year as part of our Norooz Campaign.
- Purchased and replaced old and unsafe oil-burning heaters with new electric heaters (equipped with safety valves) at 257 impoverished village preschools (Roostamahd) in Sistan and Baluchestan, Iran.
- Provided daily meals for all the children attending MAP's Learning and Vocational Training Center in Cambodia.
- Provided food and basic provisions to children living in refugee camps in Turkey.
- Provided basic provisions to the victims of the tsunami in Japan.



AFRICA (Senegal, Sierra Leone)


- Provided solar cell power and repaired water wells to provide clean water at 30 impoverished village schools in Sierra Leone.
- Provided regular meals to impoverished children in Senegal through our Nutrition Program at four MAP constructed schools.

Health & Wellness Program

According to a new report by the World Bank and the World Health Organization, at least half of the world's population is too poor to access essential healthcare services. MAP offers a variety of health and wellness programs tailored to the specific needs of the children and the community they live in. Our programs provide children with health services and tools to support their mental, physical, and educational growth and maturity.

- Provided free healthcare to hundreds of Cambodian children and families living in slum communities.
- Completed the construction of two health clinics as part of our Kermanshah Earthquake Reconstruction Program in Iran.
- Provided much-needed equipment and renovations at Omide-Farda and Avizeh Special Needs Centers in Tehran, Iran. These centers provide mental and emotional therapy programs to disadvantaged children.
- Continued providing therapy for special needs children at Farkhondeh Center in Tehran, Iran.
- Provided wheelchairs and handicap equipment for disabled children and youth in the flood-stricken regions of Gilan, Golestan, Lorestan, Khuzestan and Fars in Iran.
- Continued providing monthly savings, health insurance, and medical check-ups for orphaned children in Kerman, Iran.
- Supported children with hearing disabilities at Samieh Center in Kerman, Iran.
- Constructed an infant care center and orphanage in Kurdistan, Iran.
- Supported the Mental Health Program at the Shelter Network in San Mateo, California.
- Supported the Mental Health Program for teens leaving the foster care program under the supervision of CASA in Northern California.

Orphan Care Program

Orphaned and neglected children are some of the world's most vulnerable populations. According to UNICEF, the world's orphan population is approximately 153 million. We are committed to transforming the lives of these often-traumatized children by nurturing them with the love and individual attention they deserve. MAP's Orphan Care program builds self-confident, joyous, productive, and empowered adults.

We support and operate children's homes with comprehensive programs that foster personal responsibility and promote community values. We renovate orphanages that lack essential funding and resources to adequately provide for the children in their care. We provide on-going support for over 30 centers; and we strive to extend our reach into other communities in need.



Since 2008, we have accomplished the following in Cambodia, India, Iran and the U.S.

- Supported, renovated, and equipped over 30+ orphanages in various locations in Iran.
- Continued to operate MAP's privately-run girls' orphanage (Khane-ye Golha) in Kerman, Iran.
- Supported children in the U.S. foster care system through Child Advocates' Early Childhood and Teen Advocacy Programs.
- Renovated and provided basic provisions for the children at Aziza Orphanage in Cambodia.
- Continued ongoing operations of MAP's foster care program in Cambodia.
- Supported the operation of two orphanages in India, one for girls and one for boys.

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
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




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
